


JADA Symposium on Anti-Doping Science Research 2024

Emerging anti-doping science research in Japan

Tokyo, Japan – The Japan Anti-Doping Agency (JADA), commissioned by the Japan Sports Agency of the Japanese Government, successfully hosted the 2024 Symposium on Anti-Doping Science Research on December 13th, 2024. This symposium, held at Hotel Chinzanso Tokyo, brought together leading experts and researchers to discuss emerging anti-doping science and its applications in supporting clean sport.



The symposium, themed "Emerging Anti-Doping Science Research in Japan," featured a series of insightful presentations and discussions. Prof. Akama Takao, Chair of JADA, opened the event with welcoming remarks, followed by Dr. Murofushi Koji, Commissioner of the Japan Sports Agency and Asia representative of the WADA Executive Committee, who emphasized the importance of scientific research in anti-doping efforts.

The afternoon session, titled "The Latest Anti-Doping Science in Japan," began with a keynote speech by Prof. Suzuki Hidenori on the "Research and Development of Doping Test Technology in Japan".

Then, the symposium concluded with some Japanese research presentations and a round table discussion with Japanese researchers. Mr. Asakawa Shin, CEO of JADA, provided closing remarks, highlighting the importance of continued collaboration and innovation in anti-doping science.

Participants left the symposium with a deeper understanding of the latest advancements in anti-doping research and a renewed commitment to fostering a clean sport environment.
